Today you need to “crack the cryptogram code” below.

How does a cryptogram work? Each letter in the alphabet is replaced by another letter. Once you figure out which letter has replaced which other letter, you will find the code is easily broken.

To help you on this one, here are two clues:

1. The quotation is from Gospel of John in the Bible. In fact, it describes an appearance of Jesus Christ to the Apostles after His Resurrection!
2. The first word in the cryptogram code is “Jesus.” So, you know that the code letter “L” is used to replace “J,” “X” is used in place of “E,” “W” for “S,” and code letter “J” stands for “U.” The rest is up to you. Have fun!

#### Here is a prayer that Jesus gave Saint Faustina that we can use for this intention:

Most Merciful Jesus, Goodness Itself, You do not refuse light to those who seek it of You. Receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of those who have separated themselves from Your Church. Draw them by Your light into the unity of the Church, and do not let them escape from the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart; but bring it about that they, too, come to glorify the generosity of Your mercy.

Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls of those who have separated themselves from Your Son’s Church, who have squandered Your blessings and misused Your graces by obstinately persisting in their errors. Do not look upon their errors, but upon the love of Your own Son and upon His bitter Passion, which He underwent for their sake, since they, too, are enclosed in His Most Compassionate Heart. Bring it about that they also may glorify Your great mercy for endless ages. Amen.
